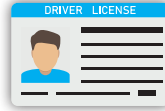


## Election Changes for Anstey

There is a new requirement to show photo ID at polling stations and this is being introduced for the first time for the elections in May. Residents in Anstey will be required to show an accepted form of photo ID when voting at polling stations.



Suitable ID accepted is your driving licence; passport; blue badge; bus pass, out of date ID can still be used if it still looks like you.

If you do not have one of the suitable forms of ID you will be able to apply for a free ID called a 'Voter Authority Certificate' which can only be used for elections.

If you are worried about this, you may find it easier to apply for a postal vote but you need to do this by 18th April 2023 at the latest. All the information you need is on our website: [www.bradgateconservatives.org.uk](http://www.bradgateconservatives.org.uk) or please contact one of us
